
Ms. Aceves,

RESOLUTION NO. 2023-34

**RESOLUTION ADOPTING A LIST OF PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024 FUNDED BY
SB 1: THE ROAD REPAIR AND ACCOUNTABILITY ACT OF 2017**

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1 (SB 1), the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017) was passed by the Legislature and Signed into law by the Governor in April 2017 to address the significant multi-modal transportation funding shortfalls statewide; and

WHEREAS, SB 1 includes accountability and transparency provisions that will ensure the residents of Tehama County are aware of the projects proposed for funding in our community and which projects have been completed each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Tehama County must adopt by resolution a list of projects proposed to receive fiscal year funding from the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA), created by SB 1, which must include a description and the location of each proposed project, a proposed schedule for the project's completion, and the estimated useful life of the improvement; and

WHEREAS, Tehama County, will receive an estimated \$4M in RMRA funding in Fiscal Year 2023-24; and

WHEREAS, Tehama County is receiving SB 1 funding which enables Tehama County to continue essential road maintenance and rehabilitation projects, safety improvements, repairing and replacing aging bridges, and increasing access and mobility options for the traveling public that would not have otherwise been possible without SB 1; and

WHEREAS, Tehama County has undergone a robust public process to ensure public input into our community's transportation priorities/project list; and

WHEREAS, Tehama County used a Pavement Management System to develop the SB 1 project list to ensure revenues are being used on the most high-priority and cost-effective projects that also meet the community's priorities for transportation investment; and

WHEREAS, the funding from 2023-24 SB 1 will help Tehama County maintain the existing roadway system and rehabilitate 60 miles of streets/roads throughout Tehama County this year and similar projects into the future; and

WHEREAS, the 2018 California Statewide Local Streets and Roads Needs Assessment found that the Tehama County's streets and roads are in a "poor" condition and this revenue will help the County increase the overall quality of the road system and over the next decade will bring the streets and roads up to an "at-risk" condition; and

WHEREAS, the SB 1 project list and overall investment in our local streets and roads infrastructure with a focus on basic maintenance and safety, investing in complete streets infrastructure, and using cutting-edge technology, materials and practices, will have significant positive co-benefits statewide.

NOW, THEREFORE IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED AND FOUND by the Board of Supervisors of Tehama County, State of California, as follows:

1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct.


